



How we teach at Frogmore



At Frogmore we have a child-centred, play based approach to learning.

We set activities around the interests and needs of the children, capitalising on topical events that are happening. We inspire awe and wonder by asking questions and investigating the world around us.

Each half term we have a hook to enhance the children's opportunities for learning. This year we have learnt about Pirates and Traditional Tales (autumn) Superheroes and Animal Adventures (spring) Space and Friends of Frogmore (summer).

As children learn through play, adults embed themselves in the environment in order to help children follow their own lines of enquiry.

We use characteristics of effective teaching and learning and have given them their own Dinosaur personas.

We develop children's independence and resilience.

Each half term, we meet a different dinosaur persona who helps us in our learning. These are

Detail Dactyl


Solve-a-saurus

We use the Read, Write, Inc scheme at Frogmore.


When your children first start school we will be working on listening games, enjoying rhymes tuning into sounds and sound discrimation. We will be playing blending and segmenting games.

Once the children are ready we will begin teaching them individual sounds, blending cv words and cvc words and working up to reading simple sentences.

We will be holding a workshop in the autumn term to tell you more about how we teach reading.



Maths




When teaching maths, we use White Rose and the Developing Number Scheme from the National Centre for Excellence in the Teaching of Mathematics.

One of the advisors for this scheme created the hugely popular Numberblocks series and these characters feature within our mathematics sessions.

CARER AND CHILD LUNCH AT SCHOOL



We will be inviting your child and one carer into school on Wednesday 18th June to have lunch at school. Home Visits



The class teachers from Van Gogh and Monet classes will be visiting the children in their homes from Thursday 4th – Tuesday 9th September. This is a valuable opportunity as it gives teachers the chance to meet your child in their home environment whereby they can find out about each child's interests, their pets and things that are important to them.

Your child will be given a balloon at the stay and play session. This balloon is for an adult to inflate and your child to decorate and leave it outside your home. This is to show the staff where you live and also as an activity for you and your child to welcome class teachers into your home.



Transition into school

Transition talks

We will be starting the process of completing preschool visits/calls to gather information about your child from their key worker.

Transition resources

We will be making a social story available with pictures of the staff and classroom to familiarise your child with the setting.




During your child's home visit you will be given a Chatterbag. This is a paper bag that your child can decorate and put items inside that are important to them. We will be using these bags to get to know each other and will be sharing the contents in small groups. The bags will stay at school until all of them have been shared, so please do not put anything inside that your child will need to use or is very precious e.g: comforter. Please name all items inside the bag.

- Return your child's admissions booklets to the school office
- Complete your child's 'All about meet booklet' for the September home visit.
 - Ensure you have registered for school apps as vital information and school newsletters will be shared with you this way.
 - Look at the school lunch options with your child.
 - Look at the classroom notices displayed by classroom doors.

Ways to help at home

At Frogmore we adopt a Can-do-it-tops attitude, we persist and are resilient with tricky challenges. To prepare your child for school, please encourage the following:



- Stop the use of dummies, bottles and pushchairs.
- Express their needs appropriately e.g. say if they need the toilet, if they are hurt or unwell
 - -Recognise own name in print
 - . Use the toilet independently (this does include wiping their own bottom).
 - Wash and dry hands.
 - Recognise and put on their own coat.
 - Sit up at a table.
 - Put their shoes on the correct feet.
- Eat their lunch at a table using a knife and fork (we will support the children with cutting up their school dinner, but we do expect them to eat with a fork and not their fingers).
 - Have a try at dressing themselves (we appreciate that socks are tricky).
 - Sit sensibly to listen to a story or a piece of music for up to ten minutes (this does not include screen time).
 - Being able to take turns when talking and not talk over someone else.
 - Follow simple instructions (e.g. playing games, completing tasks).
 - Share and take turns.
 - Tidy up things they have used.
- Lose at a game (this might seem a little strange, but many children come to school never having lost at a game due to very kind family members letting them win. It can then come as quite a shock when they get to school and another child wins and some children don't know how to cope with this first experience of losing).
